New Member - Application

Procedure for applying to join the Peninsula Pistol Club

1. FORM 1 to be completed by the applicant.
2. The following are then forwarded to the Peninsula Pistol Club;
 - (a) FORM 1 (1 x Copy);
 - (b) 2 x Character References;
 - (c) 1 x passport size photograph or a digital version emailed to the secretary; and
 - (d) Payment covering the joining fee of \$175 plus annual subscription of \$350 (or pro-rata if applying part way through the year) = Total of \$525 less pro-rata, if applicable (based on 2015/16 Fee Structure). Payment can be made via BPAY, EFT or Cheque – cash payment is allowed but not preferred.
3. All applications to join the Peninsula Pistol Club will be tabled for approval at the next Management Committee Meeting, which are held on the last Tuesday of each month at the Club – prospective members should attend this meeting at 7.00PM for an interview – there is no necessity to bring any payment to the Meeting as you will be invoiced if accepted for Club Membership. The most important form to bring with you is the FORM 1 Application to Join.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. All applicants under the age of 18 must have a parent or guardian join (for supervision purposes) who must continue to be a member of the club until the junior has reached the age of 18 years.
2. Annual Fees are :- Juniors = \$160, Spouses = \$180 and Adults = \$350.
3. Joining Fee = \$175 (note there are no joining fees for juniors and Spouses).
4. All members are expected to attend at least half of the working bees held each year (currently 4 working bees are held each year) unless paying an extra \$100 each year for exemption from working bees and duty officer functions.
5. All members are expected to be Duty Officer for one day each calendar year unless paying the exemption fee covered at item 4.
6. All new members must attend the Introduction to Handguns & Range Safety Course. This course is a general introduction to handguns and basic Range safety, it incorporates the Police mandatory Safety Course but does not replace it.
7. All new members must apply for a Provisional Handgun licence (licences are issued for up to 12 months duration).
8. After 6 months, and provided the member has attended the required number of range participation attendances and completed the required safety courses, the member may apply for a full Handgun licence for target pistol shooting.
9. Club pistols are available for members during training and after obtaining their own licence.
10. In order to retain pistol licenses, members must attend the minimum participation requirements as set out by the Police Licensing & Regulation Division (“LRD”) from time to time – please refer to the Police LRD site for the most current requirements.
